Inclusion & Accessibility Impact Summary

At Eureka!, accessibility and inclusion are at the heart of everything we do – from exhibition design to staff training, family programmes, and partnerships. Our mission is to break down barriers and ensure all children, young people and families can engage with science, culture and society.

Key Achievements

- All audio-visual content includes BSL interpretation and subtitles.
- 5 Relaxed SENDays run throughout the year with ticket sales capped at 1/3 capacity to ensure comfort and inclusion.
- Changing Places toilet and quiet 'Chill Out Room', with additional quiet spaces available.
- Online Sensory Guide co-developed with autistic children to support visit planning.
- NaviLens QR codes introduced in 2025 for blind and partially sighted visitors.
- Inclusive tourism packages launched in 2025, in partnership with Tourism for All.
- Accessible programming: Sensory Stories, BSL interpreted performances.
- Volunteering placements for young adults with profound and multiple learning disabilities.



Impact Evidence
